**GENERAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR SUMMER SCHOOL**

- A minimum enrollment of approximately 10 students is necessary for a course to be offered.
- The regular rules at Arrowhead concerning conduct and behavior apply in the summer session.
- After enrollment, no pupil will be excused from summer school for any reason other than personal illness or an unforeseen emergency. Summer school students are expected to attend for the full-specified term of the course.
- Students absent from **Arrowhead Full Credit Summer School** for more than four sessions will be dropped and an "F" placed on the transcript. PE Adventure Education students are allowed NO absences. **Credit Recovery** classes are allowed no more than two absences.
- Courses identified with an (\*) are generally recognized as academic units for college admission purposes.
- The program is available to all residents of the Arrowhead School District who have satisfied book rental and/or miscellaneous fees as indicated.
- Children in the school district on a vacation basis will be considered as resident students providing they and their parents or legal guardians reside within the school district for the full duration of the course selected.
- Terms to Know:
  - **Grade level:** Refers to the grade the student will be in during the 2012-2013 school year. (e.g. 9 means incoming ninth grader)
  - **Online:** Course work will be done online and teachers are expected to maintain regular office hours. Students are expected to meet face to face at least once during the summer.
  - **Hybrid:** Course work is a mix of online work and regularly scheduled class time.

**Two Types of Summer School Course Offerings****FULL CREDIT SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES**

Arrowhead Full Credit Summer School will be from June 11 – July 19, 2012, Monday through Thursday. Classes meet for 2 ½ hours per class for 6 weeks. There are no classes on July 4. All courses are held at North Campus.

Students will receive details on the Full Credit Summer School classes during the regular course registration process for next school year. Request will be honored in priority of class in school (Example: Seniors first, then juniors, etc.) and the date of registration. Online registration must be completed and all forms returned by February 3. If there are sufficient students enrolled to offer the course, students may continue to add if space is available. The final deadline for enrolling is Friday, June 7, 2012.

**Students who drop a full credit course after the first week will receive an "F".**

Summer School full credit courses are listed by department. Courses that are offered online or as a hybrid are noted in the descriptions.

**CREDIT RECOVERY COURSES**

Credit Recovery Courses are 4 weeks (June 18 - July 12, 2012). All sessions are held at North Campus.

Registrations for all **4-week** Credit Recovery Courses must be completed by 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday,, June 12, 2010. Students must complete the Summer School Enrollment Form located on the Web. Students may be placed in a time period depending on enrollment demands. Registration may be made by mail (800 North Avenue, Hartland, WI 53029) or in person at Arrowhead High School North Campus Attendance Office. See page 11 for offerings

Grades for successful completion of a Credit Recovery Course will be raised one letter grade (e.g. F to D, D to C, C to B, and B to A). Any grade earned in a Credit Recovery Course must be achieved at the level of the grade desired (e.g. The student wishing to raise a grade from a B to an A, must achieve an A.

**FULL CREDIT SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES**

Arrowhead Full Credit Summer School will be from June 11 – July 19, 2012, Monday through Thursday. Classes meet for 2 ½ hours per class for 6 weeks. There are no classes on July 4. All courses are held at North Campus.

Online registration must be completed by students entering grades 10, 11 and 12 for Full Credit Summer School. Students should complete this process utilizing directions on the Arrowhead Web. Students entering grade 9 must complete a Summer School Course Selection Sheet to enroll in Full Credit options.

Policies and procedures relating to full credit summer school follow:

- A minimum enrollment of approximately 10 students is necessary for the course to be offered.
- Students absent from **Arrowhead Full Credit Summer School** for more than four sessions will be dropped and an “F” placed on the transcript. PE Adventure Education students are allowed NO absences.

Students will have a firm foundation for further study in the visual arts as well as an appreciation of the role the arts have played in the development of our civilization and culture.
