- Use any online resources I put on the webpage to practice (Powerpoints, extra worksheets, listening practices, etc.)
- We have after school student tutors available through Spanish National Honors Society.
- Schedule to come in for some extra help.

## **Descripción del curso:**

Students will begin to develop Spanish reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills. The year is organized thematically with essential questions to guide learning such as:

*What does daily life look like around the world?*

*How does where you live affect what you eat?*

*Why and how do people celebrate around the world?*

*How does health care differ around the world?*

*How does technology affect the way we live?*

*What makes a house a home around the world?*

Major Spanish-speaking countries will be discussed as well.

To practice and apply their skills, students will complete daily activities, participate in class discussions, write compositions, and give oral presentations individually and collaboratively. Also, an emphasis will be placed on conversation skills in real-life situations so that students learn to communicate authentic messages in Spanish.

### **Política de asistencia:**

Attendance is extremely important because new material is presented daily at a rigorous pace. Therefore, frequent absences will be detrimental to student success. Being late disrupts the class, so please come to class on time.

### **Política de tarea:**

All homework is to be done on time. Daily assignments must be completed at the beginning of each class period. **If you fail to complete your homework, you will receive an after-school 20-minute detention.** If you fail to serve your detention, you will receive a Saturday detention. When there is no written assignment, you are expected to review vocabulary and notes on your own. Students with an excused absence have **ONE WEEK** to make up tests and quizzes in the study hall room. This can be done during study hall or after school. If you miss in-class listening or speaking activities, you have **ONE WEEK** to make them up and they must be done **by appointment with the profesor.** After that, your grade will remain a ZERO per school policy.
